Funded by The Newton Fund, FAPESP, and The British Council, the programme is an opportunity for early career researchers based in the UK and Brazil (state of São Paulo) to interact, learn from each other and explore opportunities for building long-lasting research collaborations.

The workshop on governance, crime and international security will bring together early career researchers in an interdisciplinary format. Participants are expected to come from across the social sciences, including (but not limited to) Anthropology, Geography, History, International Relations, Law, Political Science, Sociology, and Urban Studies.

Participant research interests can relate to any region of the world.

Participants will have costs covered to attend the workshop, including: travel (international and local), accommodation and meals, and travel insurance. PUC-SP will organize flights (if necessary) and accommodation for Brazilian participants (from the state of São Paulo). FAPESP accepts no responsibility for any problems which may occur with travel or accommodation arrangements or any other issues participants might experience when the participants are away from their home.

The Workshop

The workshop will engage early career researchers from UK and Brazil (from the state of São Paulo) with a new and challenging context for understanding governance, crime and security, using less familiar methodologies and contexts.

The workshop includes an activity focused programme to generate academic debate, network sessions, involvement of CSOs and public actors, as well as talks about international cooperation in research. We aim to test the impact and limits of innovation in policy and intervention to crime and security in a major city such as Sao Paulo, including by familiarization through site visits.

Discussion and presentations will cover city policing, drug policy and rehabilitation, gun control, and monitoring transnational crime, through direct engagement with stakeholders in

government, national and international organizations. We aim to develop new ideas for analysis of governance, crime and security, including new methodologies and exposure to new data sources, examine these with aim to reduce violence, crime, and insecurity, especially among poorer communities.

Participants will present their research as short informal presentations, receive feedback, and be encouraged to prepare blog posts for dissemination through LSE Latin America Centre (https://blogs.lse.ac.uk/latamcaribbean/) and the Brazil Research Group on International Conflicts (GECI) (https://outraspalavras.net/terraemtranse/)

<u>The workshop will be conducted in English</u>, with interpretation during site visits and stakeholder engagement as required.
